INVOLVING YOU...Larry Snow

Her name is Amy. She is a person, a human being fearfully and wonderfully made in God's image. We met last week. You may have seen her around town too. She is homeless. Inexplicably, she is always trying to get "somewhere else" but is never able to "arrive". Our conversations with her were circular and confusing. Her language is rough and sometimes inappropriate. She spoke of the western United States, told us of a boat she was trying to catch that was embarking from the Florida coast (a veteran was waiting for her there), and a German pass port held for her by a lawyer that she was only supposed to call once. Amy is mentally ill, dehydrated, malnourished, and broken. What would you do?

"For I was hungry and you gave Me food." We gave Amy food and some essentials from one of our Room Inn Our Hearts bags. She was appreciative and knew just what she was looking for. After a brief respite in our lobby she was off to Huck's, Rite Aid, and other points around town. We later learned another church had given her money, and that she had acted inappropriately toward one of their employees.

We were all troubled by this one. She had no ID, but in conversation had told us her last name (a very unique name), and that she had a brother who lived in Colorado. With the help of Facebook we were able to go the second mile and contact her brother. Here is what he said, "I will forward this to my parents. They have bent over backwards to help her for many years. We didn't even know where she was. Thanks for your help."

Amy's situation chronicles both the heartbreak and hope that are part and parcel in our effort to see Jesus in those that come our way. We do the best we can given obstacles that so often seem insurmountable. Our best efforts are made possible by your generosity each and every week. Our efforts are your efforts. Whether you are blessed to be able to contribute greatly or the 'widow's mite', each is making a difference. Thank you.

Perhaps you are still left wondering about Amy. As of this writing we have heard from another of her brothers who shared the following: Amy suffers from schizophrenia; she has been in and out of treatment for over 30 years; recovering and acquiring a job and housing, then relapsing over and over again; and that she had two children taken from her because of her inability to care for them. They were adopted. Her family had not known where she was for over a year. They were grateful to know and willing to help.

As of this writing we don't know where Amy is. What we do know is that we did what we could "and then some." We are often left, just as you are, with a desire to know the rest of the story. Unfortunately, the nature of this work is that of an unfinished process in the lives of broken people of which we are but a mere stop along the way. Please express your appreciation to Kim Anderson, Allee Cude, Shawn Harmon, and Pamela Massie who deal with this kind of situation on a daily basis. Also, remember our Room Inn Our Hearts ministry. It is very hard not to take this home with you. Finally, special thanks to Allee Cude who served so well as our summer office intern.


