# **INVOLVING YOU...Larry Snow**

Come unto me, all ye that labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.

Matthew 11:28-30

The more we learn about Jesus, the more we find our rest in Him. We will experience rest as we obey three commands of Jesus. The first command is "Come to Me!" Jesus regularly invited people to come to Him to meet their needs. We become a Christian through a choice we make to answer His invitation to turn from our old ways and come to Him, rendering obedience to Him.



Second, we will experience rest for our souls as we also obey Jesus' command of "Take My yoke upon you!" The word "yoke" is used metaphorically to refer to submission to a teacher. The fatal mistake for the believer is to seek to bear life's load without the yoke of Christ. God never intended for us to carry His burden alone; therefore, Christ deals only in "yokes", a neck harness for two. The secret of peace and victory in the

Christian life is found in putting off the taxing collar of "self" and accepting the Master's relaxing "yoke".

Jesus' third command is "Learn from Me!" We come, take up His yoke and the learning process begins. His meekness draws us to Him with our cares and concerns. Give all your worries to Him, because He cares about you. I Peter 5:7...NLT

Funerals are for the living, not the dead. Our smallness on earth is never as obvious as when a loved one moves on to the other side. Our grief, like us, is what is left behind. I watched my father gasp for his last few breaths one Sunday after church when I was nine. Somehow I knew, on that day that started like hundreds of others, that he was gone, whisked away in that torrent of sirens.

Sitting through his funeral I was struck by the sheer number that attends when a life erupts at forty and departs. The volume of tears that flow when death is rash and unexpected challenges the norms of our world, with so many people simultaneously questioning, "What if that had been me! What have I done with my life? Does it even matter? Am I ready to meet God?" We sit sniffling, riddled with questions that have nothing to do with our dearly departed. Singular focus comes to our own mortality, our own soul, our survival now that they are gone.

The grief which lingered was being left behind. At nine years of age, I thought, "How long will it take to see my Dad again?" I was staring down a lot of years, alone. None of us ever doubted where Dad was going or whether we would see him again. Of course we would! We have a hope and a promise, and so, our grief was different. I used to think this passage meant we weren't to cry or be terribly sad. But I was sad.

Since then I have watched my grandfather-in-law age ninetyplus, sing to his darling the Tennessee Waltz in the middle of her funeral then cry out, "Oh Minnie, why did you have to leave me?" The two had not been separate for more than twenty minutes in over forty years. But I knew it would not take long for them to find each other again, and they would get to leave their frail bodies behind this time. We will not grieve like the world. But we can be sad.

The sweet Grandmother gripped my hand when she no longer had a mind that worked. Eyes sealed shut, she muttered and mumbled to those waiting on the other side, and I was jealous. I knew my father was just right there, waiting to grab her hand from mine. It was the closest I've come to him in over thirty years. I wouldn't grieve because she was almost there. Be sad? No way!

Today I watch my mother struggle for each step as her body and health begin to fade. She has taught me to be strong and make our way through the storms of life depending on the very breath of the LORD. Every day she gets a little bit closer to reaching my Dad, and she can't wait to be with him forever. I know that when it is her time she will be running toward her one and only love, bursting through the stars and the confines of this earth. It's taken a long time for her to get there, but life is sweeter on the other side.

I will grieve, but not as the world, since I'll be seeing all of them very soon in the great scheme of things!
